1 Summary

Ninety-four gravestones of various sorts were recorded in a survey of one section of the graveyard of St Mary the Virgin church at Dedham in 2007. Twenty-six of the gravestones had become overgrown with turf and were located by probing and then uncovered by hand. The gravestones within the survey area had been erected at dates ranging between 1883 and 1984, although almost all the burial plots had been laid out in a systematic way, row by row, between 1883 and 1908.

2 Introduction (Fig 1)

- 2.1 This is a survey of gravestones in one part of the graveyard of St Mary the Virgin Church in Dedham, Essex (Figs 1-2). The survey was carried out on the 8th-10th May and 11th-12th July 2007 by the Colchester Archaeological Trust (CAT) on behalf of St Mary the Virgin Church PCC.
- 2.2 The village of Dedham is situated 10km north-east of Colchester. St Mary the Virgin Church is the parish church, and dates from the late 15th century. The building stands in the centre of the village, on the south side of the High Street. The main graveyard is located to the south of the church at national grid reference TM 3305 0573. It is bounded by brick walls to the west and east and by an iron railing to the south.
- 2.3 Lack of space in the graveyard prompted the PCC to look into removing gravestones from one part of the graveyard in order to re-use the space. The area concerned measures about 23 by 36m. It was chosen because there appear to be no vaults in the area and because most of the graves here are at least 100 years old.
- 2.4 A magnetic gradiometer survey was carried out in July 2006 by Dr Tim Dennis of the University of Essex. The site was unsuited to the technique because of strong interference from ironwork on and around extant graves, but nevertheless produced indications of two lines of small-area anomalies in otherwise clear areas of ground. There is, however, no evidence to connect these with possible burial vaults (Fig 3).
- 2.5 This report follows guidelines in *Recording and analysing graveyards* (CBA 2002).

3 Aims

The aim of the survey was to:

- record the dates inscribed on the gravestones.
- record the names of those buried so that any living relatives could be contacted,
- locate any gravestones that had become covered over.




Fig 1 St Mary the Virgin Church, Dedham: location of gravestones recorded.

4 Survey (Figs 1-2)

- 4.1 Ninety-four gravestones were recorded in the survey area. Most are upright headstones. However, some have been laid flat or have become obscured by turf as a result. In order to locate those that were no longer visible, a pole was used to probe the area. The probing was done in a systematic fashion by walking up and down the area, probing approximately every 200mm. Twenty-five gravestones were located in this way. They were subsequently exposed by hand-digging.
- **4.2** Each gravestone was assigned a number. Individual records of gravestones were entered on CAT pro-forma recording sheets. The position (ie upright, leaning, below ground) of each gravestone, the type of gravestone, its condition and its inscription was recorded.
- **4.3** Colour photographs of each gravestone and of the site were taken with a digital camera.
- 4.4 The position of each gravestone was plotted using an Electonic Distance Measuring Device and overlaid onto a map. On Figures 1-2, a cross indicates a headstone and a circle represents a footstone. Each upright gravestone faces east.

- **4.5** An east-west row of recent gravestones in the centre of the survey area was not included.
- **4.6** The gravestones are numbered 1-91; nos 60, 66, 67, 68, 72 and 86 are not used in the inventory. Headstones and footstones share the same numbers. See inventory.

5 The gravestones

- 5.1 The condition of the gravestones is variable, with some having been colonised by mosses, lichen and algae. Others have been weathered, which has rendered their inscriptions difficult to read. Some moss was removed where it was covering inscriptions. The lichen and algae are less obscuring and so were generally left undisturbed.
- 5.2 The headstones under the turf have obviously been upright previously and have either fallen down or more likely been pushed over deliberately. For safety reasons, an earlier vicar had a policy of pushing over headstones which were leaning (the Rev Moates pers comm).
- **5.3** Several types of gravestones are represented. These can be summarised as follows:

No basic headstones excluding crosses (eg no 1)	54 plus 2 possibles
No crosses (eg no 17)	11 plus 1 possible
No of scrolls (eg 81)	5 plus 1 possible
No of shields (nos 69, 74, 79)	3
Number of plaques (nos 84, 85)	2

No of kerb with small plinth (no 5)	1
No of footstones	9
No of unidentifiable types	2
Total	90 plus four possibles

- **5.4** The earliest datable gravestone is 1883. The latest is 1953.
- 5.5 The dates of 116 deaths were transcribed from the gravestones. The earliest recorded death is 1835 and the latest is 1984. Twenty-eight are after 1907 and thus occurred less than 100 years ago. The two earliest dates of death (1835 on no 22; 1869 on no 78) are not likely to indicate that the deceased were buried there. The two people concerned were simply being remembered on the stones.
- 5.6 The names of two stonemasons appear on the stones: Watts (no 4) and Saunders (no 62). The Watts firm still trades today.

6 Discussion

- 6.1 The dates and distribution of the gravestones across the survey area indicate that the burial plots had been laid in north-south rows starting at the west side of the cemetery (Fig 4). There is no obvious clustering of related burials. This suggests that there are no family plots but instead the burial plots were allocated as the need arose, just as in a modern municipal cemetery. The earliest row dates to around 1883. The latest one belongs to the years 1907-1911, showing that it only took around 29 years for the area to be filled up with graves. As was normal, many of the plots contain interments added some years after the plot was set out (the average number of bodies per plot as indicated by the inscriptions is 1.50), and a few more plots were squeezed into the area in much more recent times where space would permit it (ie no 5 and the unrecorded row of graves along the east-west path which originally crossed the survey area).
- 6.2 The number of north-south rows in the survey appears to be fifteen. The average width of each grave plot was around 1.0 m. The total estimated number of plots within the survey area is therefore around 375. If the average number of bodies per plot is 1.50 as indicated by the inscriptions, then the total number of bodies in the whole survey area is likely to be around 563, ie 500-600.

- 6.3 The oldest gravestones in the churchyard cluster around the church. The absence of any in the survey area suggests that this part of the churchyard was an extension southwards onto land that was previously open. The extension presumably dates to 1883 or shortly before. The character of the brick walls to the east and west is consistent with such a date. If the survey area does indeed lie in a 19th-century extension to the churchyard, then no earlier burials can be expected to exist within it.
- 6.4 Interestingly, the number of plots laid out between 1883 and 1911 can be used to provide a crude idea of the size of the population which buried its dead in the cemetery. The resulting figure turns out to be of the right order of magnitude for the population of Dedham parish during this period (ie *c* 1,900 falling to 1,500), and this therefore lends some support to the conclusion that there really are as many as 500-600 graves in the survey area. Of course, a study of the burial records for this period would provide definitive figures but this lies outside the scope of this project. Meanwhile we can estimate the base population for the cemetery on the following basis.

Life expectancy based on the ages of death given in the inscriptions = 65

Therefore size of base population = life expectancy x total no buried in survey area / no of years plots laid out = 65 x 434 / 29 = 973

This figure needs to be increased by about 20% (a rough estimate which could be improved by measuring the plot) to allow for the whole of the 19th-century extension to the cemetery since the survey area only covered a part of it. The result is then 1,168. This is significantly lower than the population of Dedham parish at this time. However, not everybody would have been buried in the churchyard and, more importantly, life expectancy would have been significantly less than the 65 years indicated on the gravestones. Both factors will combine to bring the estimated base population much closer to the figures for Dedham as shown in the censuses of the time. The life expectancy as indicated on the gravestones will be distorted by various factors which favour people who lived longer, particularly the underrepresentation of children in the surviving memorials in the churchyard and the fact that the better off will have been more able to afford gravestones than the poor.






Fig 2 The recorded gravestones.




Fig 3 Magnetometry survey.




Fig 4 Conjectural layout of the burial plots from 1883 to 1908.
